

Nativity of the Lord - I

Community Prayer:

Second Sunday after the Epiphany

Third Sunday after Pentecost

Community Prayer:

Fourth Sunday after Pentecost

Prayer of Confession:

Holy One, we have lost ourselves in busyness and fear and, instead of sharing your story of grace to those we meet, we duck our heads and walk by, pretending we have not seen them. Guide our hearts, O God, that we might grow in boldness in both our listening and our sharing of our Lord, Jesus Christ. Amen.

Offertory Prayer:

Eternal God, through our offerings we find ourselves aligned with the cause of Christ. We express our concern for all people and name them as our own family. We recognize their pain and their suffering and our own

struggle to find ways to help. We offer our resources to assist in proclaiming the name of Jesus Christ and to carry on your mission in our neighborhood and in the rest of the world. Amen.

Sixth Sunday after Pentecost

Community Prayer:

God of life, your word is gracious. It illuminates our lives and lights our paths. Righteous are your ways and you have called us to follow your example. You gave your own son for that purpose. In times of desperation, you remind us of your holy presence and, in good times, you guide us toward thankfulness. Remain at the forefront of our hearts and minds as we continue to worship you this day, through our Lord, Jesus Christ. Amen.

Seventh Sunday after Pentecost

Offertory Prayer:

O Lord, you have searched us and you have known us. When we rest and when we rise, you know our hearts. You have made our beds and you have tucked us in. You are our source of comfort. There is nowhere that we could hide from you. Morning and evening, you guide us to life everlasting. Use these gifts that come from the generosity that you placed inside of us to bring forth new creation in your world. Amen. (Psalm 139)

Eighth Sunday after Pentecost

Call to Worship:

O give thanks to the Lord, calling out and making known God's deeds among all people.

Sing praises to God; sing of grace and mercy. Sing of all of God's wonderful works.

Glorify the Lord's holy name; let the hearts of those who seek also rejoice.

Seek the strength of Lord; seek to be in God's presence continually.

The Lord gives good things to us as our inheritance.

Praise the Lord! Amen.

Community Prayer:

Gracious Lord, your kingdom is a treasure that we cannot hoard, but must share freely with others. We are thankful for all that you do for us in bringing us together to be a part of your people, a community of faith that we call Church. Guide us to greater understanding of the gifts that our sisters and brothers bring to the ministry of all believers, that we may see your glory made known through our work in this place. Do all this in the name of your blessed son, Jesus. Amen. (Matthew 13)

Ninth Sunday after Pentecost

Prayer of Confession:

God of reconciliation, when we want to argue and fight, you teach how to be united. When we seek discord and not harmony, you guide us toward integrity in peace. We know your way is marked with self-sacrificing love, yet we choose to go our own ways. Rather than learning to love you better and seeking to love one another as we should, we try to be right instead of compassionate. Offertory Prayer:

Lord of all understanding, you give us so many good things and we come before you in gratitude. We stand in awe and in wonder at the truth brought forth by your Holy Spirit that we might know the heart of our creator. As a sign of our thankfulness, we bring forth an offering devoted to you and your mission in this place. May it be used to share our joy with those who do not yet know the peace of your son, Jesus Christ. Amen. (Romans 9:1)

Tenth Sunday after Pentecost

Call to Worship:

Let us hear what the Lord God will say.

For God speaks peace and faithfulness to the people.

Salvation is here for those who fear and serve in God's glory.

Love and truth meet in God and we learn how to live by the example.

Beauty and goodness are God's to give and God gives freely.

Community Prayer:

Let us pray: Our God, creator and sustainer of all things, you are the one who gives us the hope of things to come. Remind us of your holy presence in our lives and of the plans that you have for us, that we might better do your will in this world, through your son, Christ Jesus. Amen.

Tenth Sunday after Pentecost

Call to Worship:

We are here to praise and thank our gracious and blessed God.

The Lord is with us and shines upon us.

In the spirit of our gladness and because of our joy, let us praise God with loudest voices.

May we make God known to everyone everywhere.

Let the nations come and find us kneeling in adoration of our king.

Eleventh Sunday after Pentecost

Call to Worship:

We called out and our prayers were answered; God strengthened us when we were weak.

In the spirit of our thankfulness, we worship our glorious God.

Community Prayer

Thirteenth Sunday after Pentecost

Prayer of Confession:

O God, you are our hope when we are not enough. It is by your grace that we are made whole. But, instead of looking to you, we look to ourselves, and our own power, and force our own wills upon each other. We watch our neighbors and we judge their actions, even when you have told us not to. Forgive us for these sins that we commit more often than we would like to admit; so that we can make your gospel known through our love and our lives. Do this through Christ, our Lord. Amen.

Fourteenth Sunday after Pentecost

Call to Worship:

Teach us, O Lord, the ways of your love.

So that we might walk in your truth.

Show us the Law of your heart.

Turn our eyes upon your face.

So that we might keep our feet firmly on your path.

In all things, O God, remind us that you are good and your way is love.

Fifteenth Sunday after Pentecost

Sixteenth Sunday after Pentecost

Call to Worship

Let our roots grow deeper and giving shade to all who need rest.

Twentieth Sunday after Pentecost

Call to Worship (Psalm 96):
